

Guided Reading

In September, our school invested heavily in a new reading program that gives all pupils in our school the opportunity to read stories that are differentiated to their reading level. As they progress, they will graduate to more challenging levels.

Our second class boys have begun the PM reading program in class and at home. Pupils are split into smaller groups and have their reading heard daily. The PM E-Reader should be used in conjunction with the in-class readers when the boys are reading at home. To ensure that this reading program can be used every day with each second class, it is not possible for the physical books to be sent home. Although we've heard great stories of pupils reading two to three books a night using the digital platform, it is most beneficial that they spend two to three days reading one book and can demonstrate understanding of what has been read and discuss key aspects of the book. It is essential that students can read fluently but also can 'read for meaning'.

Our third to sixth class boys have been taking part in the Collins Big Cat reading program. This is like PM and allows classes to break up into smaller groups where childrens' reading is heard daily. These books are also graded and allows boys to access stories that are at their reading level. These books will come home in blue folders.

In our school, we are targeting the areas of vocabulary and comprehension. When completing reading at home, it would be greatly beneficial if parents/guardians put an emphasis on these areas when reading with your child. Accompanying this newsletter will be a link to a guided reading manual with helpful tips and questions that you could raise with your child while reading.

World Cup Fever


